Pilate the judge, after announcing his verdict saying,

“I find no fault in Him at all”

(John 18:38);

decided to give the people an option to make a choice between Jesus and Barabbas.

The scripture recorded, that the people made their choice, Barabbas was their choice,

“they all cried, saying,

“Not this Man but Barabbas”.

The people's choice was the robber and not the Savior.

We may read this and say,

“Those people were stupid or foolish, how could they have chosen a well-known

robber and reject a Savior!”

We, daily are faced with that option of choice in our day to day decisions and actions.

Which option did you take? Are you checking your daily decisions to see if they are wise or foolish?


PRAYER:
