BELIEVE ALL THINGS ARE POSSIBLE

A man reported to Jesus, “Teacher, I brought You my son, who has a mute spirit -- I spoke to your disciples, that they should cast it out, but they could not” (V.17-18).

Jesus answered him, “O faithless generation”.

Note, Jesus did not blame His disciple for not being able to cast out demons, but He blamed the man for not believing.

A little later, the man was also telling Jesus, “If you can do anything, have compassion and help us”.

Therefore Jesus told him, it is not a matter of Me having enough compassion to help you, but “If you can believe, [because] all things are possible [only] to him who believes”.

Then the man realized that it was no one's fault that his child did not get healed but his unbelief had kept him from receiving.

So he cried out and said with tears, “Lord, I believe; help my unbelief!” (V.22-24).
And his son was healed.

Jesus' statement, “If you can believe, all things are possible to him who believes”; is for everyone.

No one or nothing can stop you from receiving from Jesus, what you asked for, if you believe.

Believe, is to accept, to have a firm conviction and to hold as an opinion, that you have what you had ask for, even if you do not see it yet.

For example, Ten lepers stood afar off and said to Jesus,

“Master, have mercy on us!”; He said to them,

“Go, show yourselves to the priests”

The scripture records, “And so it was that as they went, they were cleansed”

(Luke 17:12-14).

These men moved even when they had not seen any change yet, they received their healing when they believed and obeyed.

You too can ask, believe and receive what you asked for today, by believing.
